He has written for many publications (including the *New York Times*, *New York Daily News*, *Los Angeles Times*, *Washington Post*, *Smithsonian*, *Columbia Journalism Review*, billmoyers.com, *New York Review of Books Daily*) and is a longtime activist in behalf of a more decent and sustainable world.
